TBC asks you to commit to...

As a volunteer within TBC we ask you to commit to the following:

- Being a team player, embracing the vision of the church and your group and participating in good spirit with the activities of that group.
- Being reliable, recognising that the team depends on you.
- Being responsible, mucking in and not just being "on a rota".
- Being committed, doing what you do to the best of your ability.
- Being communicative, letting a group leader know if there are issues within the group or if TBC is not fulfilling its commitments to you as a volunteer.
- Being gracious, remembering that we are all human.
- Being careful, abiding by all relevant policies and procedures including safeguarding, health and safety, data protection etc.
- Being an encouraging, positive ambassador for your group.

TBC commits to...

To support you in your volunteering, TBC commits to the following:

- Praying for you in your role.
- Introducing you to how the church works and how your area of volunteering fits into church life
- Providing a role outline, either verbally or in writing, to ensure the responsibilities of the task are clear.
- Providing appropriate training.
- Giving you the opportunity to give us feedback on your volunteering responsibilities and to get feedback from us. This might include one-to-one meetings with your team leader/ someone within the team who has pastoral responsibilities and/or at team meetings.
- Respecting your gifting, availability, dignity and individual wishes and doing our best to work within them.
- Reimbursing agreed out of pocket expenses which must be claimed on an expense claim form and authorised by your team leader/budget holder.
- Consulting with you and keeping you informed of any changes to your role or the ministry or team that you volunteer within.
- Providing a safe environment.
